**1 CHILDREN AND FAMILIES:
UNDERSTANDING ATTACHMENT AND
ATTACHMENT THEORY**
(intermediate/advanced)

During this session, we will explore attachment as the enduring, affectionate, reciprocal bond that develops between a healthy child and their responsive caregiver in the first 2-3 years of life. When children receive nurturing interactions within a stable environment, they develop an internal schema for “trust of care” and “trust of control.” This then sets the developmental pathway for future emotional, physical, and cognitive growth. Contributions of theoretical pioneers in the field of attachment will be reviewed along with clinical implications.

Participants will be able to:

- identify three reasons why understanding attachment and attachment theory is important to their clinical practices
- identify three key components to attachment theory
- define three characteristics of a healthy attachment

Presenter: Joseph Kohley, LMSW, CAAC, CCS received his Masters from Grand Valley State University. As a certified substance abuse counselor and supervisor, he has worked with people with co-occurring mental health and substance abuse disorders for over 18 years. Mr. Kohley received extensive basic and intensive training through Daniel Hughes, an international leader in attachment therapy and

training and has been part of the Lakeshore Attachment Alliance since its inception. Believing in no single recipe for attachment issues/disorders, he uses a multi-modality approach. Therapies and approaches include Dan Hughes Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy, Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Theraplay, and Neurofeedback.

**2 UNDERSTANDING CHILDHOOD BROKEN
ATTACHMENTS: Attachment Breaks,
Diagnostics, Classifications, and Alternate
Nosologies** *(intermediate/advanced)*

Participants will explore how childhood experiences of neglect, abusive care and/or traumatic separations and losses can compromise a child’s development in multiple domains of life. Attachment breaks, disturbances, and traumas set up in the child a distorted view of caregivers and a shame-based sense of self. Such negative early experiences contribute to self-defeating behaviors within the child as well as difficulty developing healthful relationships throughout life. Current diagnostics of disturbed attachments, along with classifications of insecure attachments and alternate nosologies will be reviewed.

Participants will be able to:

- identify five micro or macro attachment breaks that contribute to insecure attachments
- identify at least two distinct characteristics of each insecure attachment classification
- describe the evolving diagnostics of disturbed attachments
- explain the correlation between insecure attachments and origins of psychopathology

**3 ASSESSING CHILD AND FAMILY
ATTACHMENTS FOR TREATMENT
PLANNING** *(intermediate/advanced)*

During this training, participants will explore the necessity of dynamically assessing a client’s attachments. A focus on an ecological (within relationships) rather than a behavioral approach will be emphasized. Thus, assessing the parents’ own attachment histories will be vital in using a multi-dimensional assessment process. Different assessment tools will be reviewed to help provide multi-dimensional options.

Participants will be able to:

- identify two standards of practice from AACAP regarding assessing children and teens with attachment disorders
- explain the ecological perspective, focusing beyond the symptoms checklist to relationship dynamics, complicated grief/loss, and traumatic events of abuse and neglect
- describe how to use three different assessment tools
- explain how the multi-dimensional assessment process will help guide treatment planning
