WINTER SESSION

Responsible Thinking Process ♥

First developed in 1994 by educator and social worker Ed Ford, the Responsible Thinking Process (RTP) is designed to help students develop a sense of responsibility for their own lives and respect for everyone around them. It's a school discipline process that's radically different from traditional classroom discipline and school behavior management programs. It does not involve coercion, punishment or rewards. When students have difficulties getting along with others or when they disrupt in school settings, they are taught to plan ways to get what they want without infringing on the rights of others.

Lighthouse Academy has been implementing RTP in classrooms for the past two academic years. This in-service will offer an in-depth presentation of how the process works and also provide opportunity for current and potential practitioners to discuss practical steps that can maximize effectiveness and consistency of interventions.

Collaborative Problem Solving: Introduction and Application ♥

Based on the work of Ross Greene and Stuart Ablon, CPS is an important and increasingly influential approach in working with explosive, behaviorally challenging children. The method strives to help adult care providers avoid both power struggles and "giving in" as ways to resolve conflicts. Each session will feature a short (5 - 15 minute) videos, followed by group discussion that aims to bring clinicians, administrators and direct care staff into creative dialogue on how we can implement these techniques in our programs in order to create the most effective and healthy therapeutic treatment environment possible.

FALL SESSION

Introduction to Crisis Management De-escalation ▼

During this session, you will learn the dynamics of escalating and de-escalating tension due to internal and external conflicts and their impact on children's behavior. We review the warning signs of escalating clients, identify appropriate verbal de-escalation strategies and how to use therapeutic relationships to teach crucial self-control skills. "Handle with Care" physical intervention techniques will also be taught as a last resort to keep clients safe when they present danger to themselves or to others. **The Handle with Care training requires an ability to pivot, bend, twist and stoop while bearing weight of individuals served. Ability to lift 50 lbs. non-stationary weight through the approved Handle with Care technique is required. Can you perform the essential duties of this position with or without reasonable accommodations? If you cannot meet this requirement you will be required to provide a note from your physician, to the Wedgwood Institute, prior to the scheduled training date.** Please be sure to dress comfortably and wear close-toed shoes as you will be physically active. This training is required within the first 90 days of employment for all staff who work directly with the clients in residential programs.

Ability to lift 50 lbs. non-stationary weight through the approved Handle with Care technique is required. Can you perform the essential duties of this position with or without reasonable accommodations? If you cannot meet this requirement you will be required to provide a note from your physician, to the Wedgwood Institute, prior to the scheduled training date.** This recertification training is required every six months for all staff who work directly with clients in residential programs.
