

It is the epicenter of activities and geographically the central hub of our campus.

On the back wall of the chapel sanctuary hangs a painting by Joel Schoon-Tanis titled "The Kingdom of Heaven has Room for You." Upon close inspection, one can see birds of all species, colors, and sizes perched and resting in a flourishing, life-giving tree. In the left bottom corner a hand holds out a mustard seed and directly above a dove hovers over the tree. Art is left to one's interpretation, but one can't help parse out themes of growth, inclusion, hospitality, and life in abundance. For our Wedgwood kids who are desperate for the experience of belonging, safety, and acceptance, God's generous statement — "I have room for you" — though unfamiliar, is an invitation from an extravagant host to just hang out and stay awhile.

The Nagels set up an endowing gift specifically for the Nagel Chapel to ensure its continued service to the ministry and spiritual well-being of those who enter in and desire rest. Often, Doug would call for updates, ask about our kids and whether we had adequate resources. Lois, always with words of praise and a pat on the hand, expresses her confidence in the work being done through Wedgwood's Chaplaincy and Young Life programs. With Doug's passing in December, we

Meaningful, Purposeful Work

For Michael Voss, Wedgwood's Residential Program Manager, working at Wedgwood Christian Services is so much more than a job. It's a calling.

For the last 24 years, working for a distinctively Christian, professionally excellent organization and helping people make changes to turn their lives around has been – and continues to be – crucial, meaningful work for Michael.

Wedgwood's team is full of people who have answered God's call to use their skills, talents, and passions to extend God's love to children, teens, families, and adults in West Michigan. Having worked in a variety of roles in Wedgwood's Residential Program, and in other capacities in the criminal justice and social work fields, Michael has a unique perspective on answering the call to serve others.

Here are 5 thoughts from Michael on working with a calling and purpose:

Remember who you are working with

<u>Wedgwood's Residential Program</u> provides care and treatment for children and teens who have tumultuous, trauma-filled pasts. What they have experienced results in serious mental, emotional, and behavioral health challenges.

"Despite all they have endured," Michael said, "they are still just kids."

Kids who are excited about things like roller coasters, telling someone they did well on a test, and having mac n' cheese for lunch.

Each child, teen, and adult that relies on Wedgwood's grace-filled care is a person who has immense value, and is someone that Jesus loves so dearly that he'd give his all for them. Each person is unique, precious, and important.

Keep yourself educated on the issues

Michael was once given this advice from a supervisor: "You know what the answer to the problem is, you need to learn more about the problem." Meaning: we know that God's love and grace, and the compassion of the Wedgwood team are key in the healing process.

Comfort others with the comfort we've received

When we learn exciting news or a helpful piece of advice, we want to share it with others. We want to help people as much as we can.

Michael refers to 2 Corinthians 1:4 which reminds us that we are called to extend to others the same love, grace, and comfort that God has shown us. For Wedgwood, this is the core of our mission: extending God's love to youth, adults, and families through professional counseling and educational support.

Planting and watering seeds

Transforming lives is not always a quick process. In fact, it rarely is. It can be helpful to think about it like planting and watering seeds.

"Sometimes we don't see the fruits of our labor in the way we want it or when we want it," said Michael. "But we have to trust God in the process."

Patience, while not always easy, is key. Just like plant varieties sprout, grow, and bloom at different rates, people understand, grow, heal, and change at their own pace. Sometimes that means we can see some of the impact we are making, sometimes that means we are planting a seed to prepare them for the growth that's to come.

Leave each day with no regrets

Michael's personal motto is to leave work each day with no regrets – knowing that he did all he could do with his day.

"I strive to be in step with what God is leading me to do," he said.

Whether it's sharing the encouragement with a coworker, taking the extra time to hear about a kid's day, or being intentional about following up on paperwork – do all that you can within your role to make a difference.

ami Weller is a Recovery Support Specialist within Wedgwood's Substance Use Disorder treatment services. For the last 7 years, she has walked alongside mothers in Muskegon County in their recovery journeys providing them coaching and support, setting them up for success in preventing relapse, and moving into long-term recovery and a healthier life-style. We sat down with Jami to talk about how taking steps in recovery can help people grow and thrive!



When you start working with people, what needs do they have?

Often we see women who have some of even the most basic needs like food, clothing and shelter. Once these needs are met, from starting medicated assisted treatment to finding inpatient care, to meeting with them multiple times a week to help achieve stability. A recovery journey looks different for each person. other times just having a person to talk with is what they need to get started.

In terms of your work, what does Planting Seeds mean to you?

It means to have understanding that you are not always going to see changes, or to see the difference you make in someone's have hope that the things we talk about in session are things they else down the road. I see seeds planted daily in watching people growing and thriving in simply knowing they are not alone in their path to recovery.

How have you seen people grow in our Recovery Services?

When people leave services there isn't always a guarantee that they are okay, but recently I've run into two different clients in the community after they were discharged from our services. One the physical signs of use were gone, and she was doing well in life. Another woman I ran into at a garage sale, and that's not something you do when you're using. It's encouraging to see these women thriving after leaving our services.

What do you want our readers to know about the 'Seed Planting' work that you and your team do every day?

We may not see client's bloom to their full potential in that moment but the work we do is really important. The work we do saves lives. Harm reduction saves lives. Working with people with addictions can be a very thankless job, long hours, and stressful situations, but we are making a difference. Can you imagine how someone would feel battling a disease like addiction alone? They wouldn't stand a chance. Thank you for giving people a chance. Thank you for helping make recovery possible. We are the seeds in helping to make recovery possible. 📉



For kids, who at the start of the treatment, didn't notice or care to interact with other children, this experience shows how much they can blossom with the right support and care. Their interaction was not only fun exploration of nature, but learning from each other, demonstrating communication skills, and making friends!

eed planting is really at the core of what Wedgwood's Autism Center for Child Development Jdoes.

Young kids with autism spectrum disorders come to our a center with a variety of needs and challenges - lack of effective communication, difficult behaviors and safety concerns, and delays in social and personal skill development. Our team of highly-trained and incredibly caring professionals work with each child and family to build those foundational skills that kids need to blossom on their own.

When we can teach a child to communicate and give them the tools to express their needs and wants - everything changes. When we can teach them how to observe and imitate others, it opens up a whole new way for them to learn. These seeds of new opportunity, with the care and cultivation from our team, sprout into skills that are foundational for everything else in children's lives. Like our friends exploring the flower bed — practicing safety outside, making friends, communicating with others, and learning from the natural environment are all vital to a child's success in school, which can lead to success in many key areas in a child's life.

In therapy, our team focuses on setting kids and families up for success in their 'real-lives', outside the center. At the center we are planting the seeds of valuable skills, and then we teach families how to best water and tend to their little 'sprout'. We go in to their homes and help caregivers understand and implement therapy practices, and empower families with the tools and skills to teach their children, and advocate for them.

As a community, we can remember that our 'little sprouts' and their caretakers need support from everywhere - sun and water from their surrounding environment. It can be as simple as extending grace and understanding to kids and families you come across — because you never know what is going on below the soil.



Learn to Earn

edgwood's Employment Training Program (ETP) gives teens in our Residential Treatment Program an opportunity to learn and develop crucial job and life skills. Recently, through a Positive Youth Development Grant, Wedgwood has made it possible for teens from throughout the Grand Rapids community to access these valuable workforce development services with a program called Learn to Earn.

In this 8-week program students come to Wedgwood's Employment Training Center twice a week for a lesson pertaining to employability - covering things such as filling out an application, interviewing, common paperwork and forms, and resume building - followed by hands on work experience in woodworking, sewing and upholstery, screen printing, candle making and/or lawn care. Wedgwood's ETP team builds mentor relationships and





gain their own independence as they enter adulthood.

Each day within Wedgwood's Employment Training and Learn to Earn Program, we are planting seeds, often without them even noticing

how much they are truly learning and growing. When the first sprouts of success start appearing and students see what they are capable of, that's when they really start investing in and cultivating their own growth. They will learn that growth can be a lot of work, but the fruits of their labor have a sweet pay-off. Realistically many of these students are not college-bound, so it's our job - our mission - to ensure that they are ready to be capable members of our community and that they **know their life** and what they can offer to the world is valuable and important. Through our work we are able to empower the next generation not to settle, and to create their own future full of hope and possibilities!

It has become clear in our work with teens in Wedgwood's Residential Care and within the larger community that many are severely lacking in positive role models and examples. Most have no idea on how to get a job, keep a job, and even how to leave a job without ruining their employment reputation. Kids are also dealing with low self-esteem, poor relationships, lack of adult support, and poor decision making. Our team steps up to teach them how to be a good employee which can help them



Where Success

Tedgwood's Positive Youth Development (PYD) Team works within local schools to provide empowering prevention programs for middle and high school students. They cover everything - healthy relationships, how to date (and break up!), how the choices you make can impact future goals, risk avoidance, substance use prevention, and leadership skills. In having a presence within the schools and teaching important curriculum in classrooms, the PYD team is in a unique position to not only plant the seeds of positive development through instruction, but to also help cultivate growth in students through establishing relationships. With in-school curriculum, summer programming, and community events the PYD team gives kids, and families, the skills, support, and encouragement they need to thrive — and safe place where success can grow.
