TRANSFORMING SERVICES are donor funded, enhance our core services, are critical to our successful outcomes, and help transform lives.

COMMUNITY SERVICES provide a broad range of quality treatment to children and families in West Michigan. These programs are funded through public contract sources and can be utilized by anyone in our community.

EDUCATION SERVICES provide education to residential clients, students in the community, Wedgwood staff, and community professionals.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES provide a safe place for kids to heal from the trauma of severe abuse and neglect, exploitation, and substance abuse.







Transforming Services

Chaplaincy & Youth Ministry

- ▶ 100% of residents receive a visit from a Wedgwood Chaplain within one week of admission, on their birthday, and at discharge.
- Chaplaincy & Youth Ministry hosted 18 all-agency events.

 Worship, Holiday, Socials, Movies
- ► Chaplains offered 2 all-agency, diversity-focused events.

 Diversity Food Fair; MLK Jr. Day Celebration & Essay Contes
- Our Chaplains led **94** small groups and devotionals for residents.
- ▶ 80% of kids in Residential Care were given Bibles, devotional books and/or faith journals.
- The team offered quarterly virtual prayer meetings for staff.

Recreation & Wellness

On any given day, **52%** of children currently in Wedgwood's Residential Care receive **Occupational Therapy (OT)** to improve their social and fine motor skills.

100% of residents participated in therapeutic activities — such as animal therapy, gardening group, running club, and art projects — that promote their physical, mental, and emotional well-being.

Activity Therapists plan and lead a variety of therapeutic group activities **4-7 times each week**.







Employment Training Program (ETP)

- ► Wedgwood's ETP employed **106** teens.
- Teens in Wedgwood's ETP worked a total of **10,217** hours.
- Average length of employment for a teen in Wedgwood's Residential Care is 6-8 months.
- Community-based teen participants are employed for a minimum of 8 weeks.
 40% have requested to continue employment at the end of their 8 weeks.
- ▶ 100% of teens were elevated to higher level positions within Wedgwood's ETP.
- ▶ 95% of teens who participate in Wedgwood's ETP show improvement in school and in their behavior.
- ▶ 100% of student employees say they will use Wedgwood's ETP staff as references. This year the team provided job references for 26 past and current participants.

Transforming Services

Teen CHARGE

Wedgwood's Teen CHARGE is a student leadership group that promotes peerto-peer education, encourages positive choices, and empowers teens.

WEDGWOOD CHRISTIAN SERVICES

- ▶ 15 student leaders serving as Teen CHARGE Brand Reps from 4 area schools.
- The Teen CHARGE YouTube Channel had over 7.2 hours of watch time.
- Students created **16** pieces of original content to educate and encourage peers, including graphics, videos, and TikToks.
- Student leaders spent over 10 hours of volunteering or representing Wedgwood in interviews or at events, including Wedgwood's State of the Child
- Created and helped promote a 'Teens, Social Media, and Mental Health Survey' which had 156 responses.

Wedgwood's Manasseh Project

32 in-person and online presentations, trainings, and interviews, across the state educating over **1,840** professionals, community members, and students on the risk factors, signs, implications, and best practices for treatment of commercial sexual exploitation.

Through the Human Trafficking Youth Prevention Grant, we're working with 4 school districts to implement prevention curriculum,




develop school safety protocol and parent groups. In conversation with **8 districts** to implement program in upcoming school-year.

Community Services

Through **20** different professional counseling and prevention services, Wedgwood's Community Services enables thousands of children, teens, and families in our community to lead healthy, and hope-filled lives.

Counseling



Trauma-Focused Services

- 34 families received Trauma
 Focused Cognitive Behavioral
 Therapy (TF-CBT).
- 30 families participated in Trauma Informed Parenting, a parenting class offered to parents/caregivers of children who have experienced trauma, and are part of their healing process.

Psychiatry Services

298 individuals, ages 8 - 81 received psychiatry services

Wraparound

1,200 families received comprehensive, holistic, youth and family-driven support for serious mental health or behavioral challenges.

Community Services

Substance Use Disorden Treatment

"Wedgwood is by far the most helpful and timely treatment agency I've ever worked with and I've been to a combined 25+ treatment programs since 2008,"

Wedgwood Christian Services offers **9 unique** Substance Use Disorder (SUD) programs for adolescents, adults, and families and has provided treatment for 1,057 clients in 8 West Michigan counties.

- Served individuals aged 12 - 70 years old.
- 31% of in-person sessions were provided in the home or in the community.









Autism Center For Child Development (ACCO)

- A child is typically enrolled in Wedgwood's ACCD for 3 years.
- ▶ 38 children received Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) therapy.
- ▶ 100% of children transitioned into less restrictive programs.
- ▶ 100% of children gained a functional method of communication or experienced substantial improvement in communication.
- ▶ 100% of parents participated in trainings and parent support programs.

Positive Youth Development (PYD)

Wedgwood's PYD & Prevention Programs provide evidencebased curriculum to 4,442 youth and are active in 9 schools and 1 Community Center.

Over 3,150 youth and families served through in community events, school awareness campaigns, youth summer programs, and resource fairs.

Provided **350** resource bags for families with fun giveaways and information to encourage healthy parent-child communication and empower youth.

58 parents received support and training through online & in-person workshops.

904 students participated in our in-school Prevention programs:

have a better understanding of how risky behavior impact future goals.

are confident they can make decisions to make them healthy.

are more confident they can identify healthy relationships.

made a decision to either NOT start or cut down on their use of substances.

Residential Services

126 youth received critical 24/7 treatment, care and counseling in one of our 8 residential homes.

100% of the children in Wedgwood's Residential Services have experienced some form of trauma.

- 49 adolescents received specialized treatment for behavioral and mental health issues stemming from trauma.
- 32 teens received specialized treatment for substance use disorder.
- girls received specialized treatment for trauma associated with human trafficking.
- adolescents received specialized treatment for sexual behavior issues.
- youth received specialized treatment for autism spectrum disorder and other developmental disabilities.

Education Services

- 82 students attended Lighthouse Academy within Wedgwood's Residential Program.
 - ▶ 27 middle school students
 - ► 55 high school students earned at total of 133.75 credit hours

6 of Wedgwood Residents who were behind have caught up on credits and will move on to the next grade at Lighthouse Academy.


